OUR 60th PROJECT! 136 Dehart Owner-occupied since May

Tommy Kleckner, Western Regional Director of Indiana Landmarks, had been watching 136 Dehart's rehab with great interest. After attending our Open House last fall, he wrote the following article for publication in *Indiana Landmarks Current News* ("Repeat Rehabbers: Sixty and Counting" 11/10/2014).

West Lafayette's New Chauncey Housing, Inc. (NCHI) reached a milestone with the recent dedication of its 60th home rehabilitation project, a Colonial Revival cottage in the city's Chauncey-Stadium Avenues Historic District.

The group serves a historic residential neighborhood under significant development pressure from Purdue University, where campus expansion and conversion of single-family homes to student rental housing threaten the area's character. NCHI

works to preserve the neighborhood's historic housing stock and provide opportunities for low- to moderate-income buyers to purchase quality homes.

When NCHI bought the cottage at 136 Dehart Street, it was hidden beneath dingy aluminum siding. The group peeled off the aluminum to reveal original wood shingle siding, repaired original wooden windows, rehabbed the interior, and added fresh new paint inside and out—a stunning transformation.

Recently, NCHI celebrated its most recent rehab project. West Lafayette Mayor John Dennis, Indiana State Representative Sheila Klinker, and NCHI Executive Director Ann Brandyberry spoke at the Ribbon Cutting, on the spacious and welcoming front porch. 
